Fort Benning gate access to change

All visitors, uncleared contractors must undergo background check

Beginning Jan. 1, those who attempt to enter Fort Benning without a government-issued identification card will be subject to a background check before being allowed to enter the installation.

This step is being taken to ensure that Fort Benning is in compliance with Homeland Security Presidential Directive 12, which requires installations to vet 100 percent of visitors and uncleared contractors prior to entering the installation.

"For the Soldier, Family member or civilians who already have a common

access card or military ID, it isn't going to affect them," said Chief of Department of the Army Security Guards Matthew Dillon. "They're still going to come through the gate showing that same card."

However, any CAC or military ID holder who does not have their identification with them will be treated as a visitor.

"Right now, we accept driver's licenses," Dillon said. "Beginning Jan. 1, if you show a driver's license at the gate and we ask you for a government-issued ID card and you don't produce it, you will be considered a visitor, even if you are in uniform. You'll be turned around, sent back and you'll have

Soldiers save life after crash

Three Soldiers from the 5th Ranger Training Battalion played a pivotal role in saving a civilian's life Nov. 5. Sgt. Tamyus Barnett, Spc. Leudy

Castro and Spc. Darian Haygood were returning to Camp Frank Merrill near Dahlonega, Georgia, after a maintenance run to Fort Benning when they came across an automobile accident on Interstate 185 in Harris County.

A small Kia car traveling in the southbound lane had crossed over the median and collided with an 18-wheeler, which was carrying fuel, in the northbound lane.

The three Soldiers arrived on the

The Benning Road "Stone Gate" will be closed from 6 p.m. Nov. 21 to 6 p.m. Nov. 23.

Visitors to the installation will be able to access the post through the Interstate 185, Eddy Bridge and Harmony Church access control points.

The National Infantry Museum will be open and maintain regular weekend hours. Visitors to the museum will be able to access it from South Lumpkin Road. Residents of Fort Benning and motorists on the installation will be able to access the museum from Benning Road outbound lanes.

Motorists are encouraged to avoid Benning Road between Victory Drive and Fort Benning's "Stone Gate" the weekend of Nov. 21.

Entry to the installation is strictly controlled at access control points.

All vehicles attempting to enter the installation at any access control point will be stopped and may be searched. Drivers and adult passengers in the vehicle will be asked to present identification.

Roughly 4,000 bright blue, 96-gallon recycling bins have arrived at Fort Benning as part of the housing recycling program. The



Hagel: Slain aid worker personified altruism, compassion

WASHINGTON — A former Army Ranger who worked to aid victims of the conflict in Syria personified altruism and compassion, in stark contrast to the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant terrorists who murdered him, Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel said Nov. 16.

In a statement he issued on behalf of all men and women of the Defense Department, Hagel extended condolences to the Family of Abdul-Rahman Kassig, also known as Peter Kassig, whose beheading was shown in a video ISIL released via social media.

“(Kassig) time and again volunteered his service during times of war — first as an Army Ranger in Iraq, and later as a devoted humanitarian, providing aid to victims of the conflict in Syria,” Hagel said. “Like his fellow veterans of the 9/11 generation, his strong desire to continue making a difference in the world after serving in uniform — to continue leading a life of purpose — is an inspiration to us all.”

The murder is one more reminder of ISIL’s “ruthless barbarity,” the secretary said. “There is no starker contrast between the inhumanity of ISIL and the bright and generous spirit of the young man they murdered,” he added. “As we join his loved ones in mourning his loss, we also celebrate his service, and we celebrate his commitment — a lifetime commitment to, as he said, ‘stand beside those who might need a helping hand.’”

Hagel called Kassig a young American who personified the values of altruism and compassion that are “the very essence of his adopted religion of Islam.”

“This was a young man who traveled to one of the world’s most dangerous places to care for the innocent victims of a bloody conflict, and fearlessly dedicated himself to helping those in need,” the secretary said. “There can be no greater contrast than that between Abdul-Rahman’s generosity of spirit and the pernicious evil of ISIL.”

Hagel noted that during his 13 months in captivity, Kassig’s Family, the entire U.S. government and U.S. Sen. Joe Donnelly from his home state of Indiana “worked to avoid this tragic outcome.”

“His mother’s searing plea directed to his captors is unforgettable,” the secretary added. “The fact that her appeal went unheeded is only further testament to the wicked inhumanity of the ISIL terrorists who have taken her son from her. Just as we witnessed with Jim Foley and Steven Sotloff, the sincere efforts of so many to bring home innocent hostages have been met with blood and barbarity.”

Hagel said the nation can draw inspiration from the “remarkable” devotion the slain aid worker’s parents, Ed and Paula Kassig, had for their son.

“They never stopped trying to bring him home. They never gave up,” he said. “The Kassigs raised a young man who was courageous and selfless to the core, and after seeing the way his Family fought on his behalf, it is clear those virtues define the entire Family that loved him so much.”

Guard, Reserve Soldiers to mobilize for Ebola relief

WASHINGTON — More than 2,000 Army National Guard and Army Reserve troops will be mobilized in support of Operation United Assistance in West Africa, the Department of Defense announced.

The deployments will occur in the spring as part of the next rotation of forces to relieve the 101st Airborne Division headquarters and other troops now involved in the Ebola relief effort.

About 1,200 Guard Soldiers will be mobilized from six states, along with about 850 Army Reserve troops.

Mobilizing Army National Guard units include elements of the:

- 34th Infantry Division Headquarters, Rosemount, Minnesota.

- 16th Engineer Brigade, Columbus, Ohio.

- 223rd Military Intelligence Battalion, Fort Funston, California.

- 236th Engineer Company, Lewisville, Texas and 272nd Engineer Company, Angleton, Texas.

- 294th Area Support Medical Company, Washington, Iowa.

- 891st Engineer Battalion, Iola, Kansas.

Mobilizing Army Reserve units include elements of the:

- 96th Sustainment Brigade, Salt Lake City, Utah; and Denver, Colorado.

- 313th Movement Control Battalion, Baltimore, Maryland.

- 324th Fire Fighting Detachment, Granite City, Illinois.

- 324th Expeditionary Signal Battalion, East Point, Georgia.

- 329th Survey and Design Team, Saint Joseph, Minnesota.

- 387th Medical Logistics Company, Miami, Florida.

- 398th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, Rockville, Maryland.

- 452nd Preventative Medicine Team, Miami, Florida.

- 996th Horizontal Engineer Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

- Company, 412th Civil Affairs Battalion, Columbus, Ohio.

Units will begin training shortly for their spring deployment to West Africa in support of Operation United Assistance, officials said.

The Army Reserve will deploy Soldiers who possess specialized capabilities needed by the joint-force operation to ensure human suffering is mitigated in West Africa, according to the U.S. Army Reserve Command.

“Army Reserve Soldiers are highly educated, and professionals in their civilian careers,” said Lt. Gen. Jeffrey W. Talley, chief of the Army Reserve and U.S. Army Reserve Command commanding general. “They are our doctors, lawyers, academics, scientists, engineers and information technology specialists on the leading edge of high-tech industry — a new generation of Soldiers who grew up with technology in their hands, practice it in their professions and leverage it while in uniform.”

Soldiers will not be on the front lines of treating patients, officials said.

“Preserving the health of our Soldiers is the highest priority for this mission,” said Maj. Gen. Neal Loidolt, commanding general of Minnesota’s 34th Infantry Division.

Minnesota will send nearly 700 “Red Bull” Infantry Division members to Liberia for about six months, officials said.

The Minnesota citizen-Soldiers will be assigned to synchronize the operations, logistics, personnel and resources of U.S. military forces assigned to the area.

In Kansas, about 170 Soldiers from the 891st Engineer Battalion Headquarters, Headquarters Company, and Field Support Company, based in Isola, will deploy.

Iowa’s Army National Guard will be sending about 80 Soldiers from the 294th Area Support Medical Company, based in Washington, Iowa. The unit provides medical support, including triage, basic medical treatment and sustainment of life, plus transport of sick or injured patients.

Members of this unit “will only provide direct patient care to U.S. Department of Defense personnel and coalition Service members,” an Iowa Guard news release said.

In Ohio, about 130 Soldiers from the Columbus-based Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 16th Engineer Brigade, may deploy in spring when it could be involved in a mission such as oversight of construction clinics to treat Ebola patients, Ohio National Guard officials said.

Joining the other Soldiers will be more than 150 engineers with two companies of the Texas Army National Guard. The two companies identified to provide support are the 236th Engineer Company, 111th Engineer Battalion, located in Lewisville, and the 272nd Engineer Company, 386th Engineer Battalion, from Angleton. Both are aligned under the 176th Engineer Brigade, Texas Army National Guard.

California’s 223rd Military Intelligence Battalion of San Francisco will also provide personnel. It includes interpreters, translators as well as counter-intelligence and interrogation specialists.

The Army says all Soldiers who return from duty will undergo a 21-day “controlled monitoring period” to ensure they are healthy and have not contracted Ebola.

Units were selected based on their capabilities and ability to respond to the unique demands of the mission, officials said. They will mobilize and in early 2015, as part of the second rotation of OUA forces, supporting the United States Agency for International Development.

All mobilizing Soldiers will conduct regionally specific training on Ebola prevention, malaria prevention, other medical threats, and medical readiness requirements before deploying, officials said.

Be smoke free for a day

Did you know that just 20 minutes after a person quits smoking, their heart rate and blood pressure drop? Did you know that after 12 hours, the carbon monoxide level in the blood drops to normal? Nov. 20 is the Great American Smokeout Day — a day to encourage smokers to make a plan to quit using tobacco for the day and go smoke-free for 24 hours.

About 42 million Americans still smoke cigarettes. Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death in the United States, accounting for more than 480,000 deaths each year or one out of every five deaths. According to the recent Department of Defense Survey of Health-Related Behaviors, at least 24 percent of our military personnel reported smoking cigarettes.

Smoking is especially hazardous for our Soldiers. Tobacco use decreases Soldier readiness by causing impaired night vision, respiratory illnesses, delayed wound healing, increased surgical complications and accelerates hearing loss. Tobacco not only stains your teeth, but also causes tooth decay, gum disease and various types of cancers. Smoking decreases oxygen in the muscles leading to decreased physical performance.

Breathing secondhand smoke also affects the health of other people. Secondhand smoke contains over 250 chemicals that are harmful, leading to serious health effects such as heart disease, stroke and lung cancer. It causes health problems in infants and children such as asthma, bronchitis and other lung diseases. According to the CDC, over the past 50 years, 2.5 million adults who were nonsmokers died from secondhand smoke.

On Nov. 20, join people around the world to support quitting tobacco for the Great American Smokeout. If you smoke, make a pledge to quit. If you don’t smoke, help someone to quit.

Here are a few tips to help you prepare for the day:

- Plan ahead.
- Change your daily routine for that day to help you break the habit such as taking a different route to work.
- Get rid of all tobacco in your house or car.
- Remove cigarettes, ashtrays, lighters and matches in your house, car or other

locations.

Plan alternatives or substitutes for smoking, such as:

- Chew sugar-free gum, carrots or suck sugar-free hard candy.
- Picture something pleasant in your mind.
- Go for a run.

If you feel an urge to smoke, use the 4 Ds:

- Delay the urge. Count to 100 or 200. Wait 15 minutes.
- Drink water. Water flushes out the nicotine toxins.
- Deep breaths. Deep breathing relieves stress.
- Do something else. Distract yourself. Talk with a friend or co-worker.

All of us should take this day to quit or help others to quit in order to attain a tobacco-free lifestyle. Do you want to help someone else to quit? Frustration, anxiety, irritability, and mood changes are normal reactions when a person quits smoking, so:

- Be encouraging.
- Be available to listen.
- Be understanding.

Although the Great American Smokeout encourages you to quit for one day, quitting this day can be the first day of being tobacco-free for life. Commit to quit and take an important step toward a healthier life. Resources are available to help you quit and remain tobacco-free.

Veteran now battles child predators

Retired Staff Sgt. J Christian joined the Army in 2006 to help protect and defend his country from the world's predators.

"It had always been a goal of mine and I felt that we needed more men and women to step up and serve the country," he said.

He is now protecting the country in a new way, as part of the second graduating class of a one-year program designed to give wounded, ill or injured veterans the chance to continue serving their country in the fight against child predators.

The Human Exploitation Rescue Operative Corps was developed in 2013 by ICE Homeland Security Investigations, the Department of Defense and the National Association to Protect Children. The HEROs work with ICE HSI offices across the country, where they assist special agents with criminal investigations involving child pornography and online sexual exploitation.

"The job of rescuing children from the depths of their worst nightmares is incomparable to anything that I've ever done or thought I would do," Christian said.

Christian spent his career in the 75th Ranger Regiment, serving under the U.S. Special Operations Command. He was assigned to a rifle team within C Company, 3rd Battalion, serving as rifleman, automatic rifleman, fire team leader and eventually squad leader. After sustaining multiple combat-related injuries in 2009, he medically retired in late 2013.

He was introduced to the HERO Corps through the U.S. Operation Care Coalition, which helps injured SOCOM members transition back to their teams in the military or the civilian sector.

"It has been challenging to step away from the military, but the great thing about this program is you're transitioning

from a SOCOM unit, going out and doing things that little boys dream of, to going to a program and you're never be able to prepare for the magnitude of what we're doing," Christian said.

Harold Ort, public affairs officer for the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, said the graduates come from all branches from the military.

"Each of them was interviewed by SOCOM and HSI, which vetted their abilities and backgrounds to ensure a good fit with the HERO Corps," he said. "I think all of these guys are a tremendous fit, and our intention with the program is to expand it to a corps of about 200 members over the next five years."

The graduates attended three weeks of intensive training at the Weiss Child Rescue and Protection Technology Center in Houston, where they learned about specialized software, hardware and investigative protocols that help law enforcement detect and interdict child sexual exploitation and abuse.

Later, they completed eight weeks of training in computer forensic analysis and digital evidence collection at HSI's Cyber Crimes Center in Fairfax, Virginia, to help identify and rescue child victims of sexual abuse and online sexual exploitation.

After training, HERO Corps participants report to HSI offices in more than a dozen cities across the U.S. They work under the direct supervision of

HSI special agents, conducting computer forensic exams, assisting with criminal investigations and helping to identify and rescue child victims. Christian will be assigned to ICE Homeland Security Investigations in Los Angeles.

"I'm really dedicated to honing in my skills, so the better I become in forensics, the more opportunities I have to actually make a difference in rescuing these children," Christian said. "If I can make a difference in one child's life, that would be enough to change my life. So far, with the course and what we've done, we're going to affect hundreds of people's lives."

In fiscal 2014, more than 2,300 child predators were arrested by HSI on criminal charges related to the online sexual exploitation of children, Ort said. Since 2003, HSI has initiated more than 30,000 cases and arrested more than 10,000 individuals for these types of crimes.

Christian said he hopes to spread the word to other veterans about the HERO Corps and its mission to bring child predators to justice.

"I would like to be able to continue to helping the care coalition to get the best possible men and women from special operations," he said. "We could really use these men and women that the U.S. military has already trained and have become a great commodity to this country."

scene immediately after the accident, and noticed the Kia had caught fire.

"When we arrived, the vehicle was starting to catch fire, so we hopped out and ran to the car to see if anyone was in it," Haygood said. "There was somebody inside, and he was barely conscious. We pulled him out and once we got him out, we ran to the other side of the highway and tried to stop traffic until police arrived."

The Soldiers moved the driver into the median, and noticed the 18-wheeler could potentially explode due to the fuel it was carrying. They then moved their vehicle into the median to shield the driver from the effects of any explosion.

The 18-wheeler did eventually explode three times, causing some trees and grass in the area to catch fire.

The Soldiers administered first aid to the driver until first responders arrived on scene, and then remained at the scene of the accident to help control spectators and redirect traffic until the driver was extracted and all fires were put out.

"After all the first responders got there, they were pretty thankful for the fact that we were there and assisting," Castro said. "After they arrived, we just went where we were needed. After we took care of the traffic situation and ensured that the driver of the vehicle that was struck was in a safe area and receiving first aid, we just did whatever else we could to help."

Castro said the Soldiers' Army training proved invaluable during the incident.

"It was basically instinct," he said. "We didn't really plan anything that we did. We just pulled over and ran out to do anything that we could do to assist. To be honest, we weren't really prepared for this. But, we were able to improvise with whatever the bystanders were able to provide us. With everything going on, we were still able to focus on the most important situation, which was stabilizing the driver."

Later that night, after returning to Camp Frank Merrill, the Soldiers received a special thanks.

"That night, the driver's wife called Sgt. Barnett and thanked us for helping out," Haygood said. "He went through surgery, and he was able to pull through."

Castro said he, Haygood and Barnett have received praise from their fellow Soldiers for their actions.

"They joke about it in a sense and call us heroes, but I would think it is something that any of them would do if they were in the same situation," Castro said.

bins will be distributed through the end of November to all housing units on the installation.

Each village within the Fort Benning housing will receive curbside recycling collection once per week starting in early December, thanks to efforts of Col. Michail Huerter, garrison commander, and Columbus Mayor Teresa Tomlinson, as well as the request of the residents of Fort Benning, said Keith Lovejoy, housing chief at Fort Benning.

for not only our residents, but for the whole area."

Accepted recyclable materials include plastic bottles, jars, jugs and containers, mixed paper products including junk mail, newspapers, magazines and telephone books, cardboard, metal and tin cans, and aluminum cans.

No glass or medical waste will be accepted. If unacceptable materials are seen in a bin at the time of collection, a note will be left on the bin and materials in the bin will be rejected, Lovejoy said.

City resources are being used for the program, Lovejoy said, and as it is in Columbus, it will also be here at Fort Benning, referring to the state inmates that will be picking up the recyclables.

The inmates, Lovejoy emphasized, are not from the local area, but rather are state prisoners.

The inmates are low-risk, non-violent

criminals who are individually selected to participate in the program, Lovejoy said. They will also be vetted and cleared through the Department of Emergency Services at Fort Benning.

"It's been very successful throughout the Columbus area," Lovejoy said.

The inmates will be supervised on the truck, and there will be a patrol following the truck as it makes its way through the neighborhoods.

"The city is operating in the same manner they do downtown in Columbus, with the added benefit of all being screened before coming on post," Sullivan said.

Recycling programs are not foreign to the installation. Ellis Leeder, recycling program manager on Fort Benning, said trailers have been available for some time for residents to drop off recyclables.

Leeder said collecting from the trailers was a tedious process compared to the new recycling program.

The trailers, Leeder said, will be reused in the future in other places around post rather than used for Army Residential Communities Initiative housing, such as around schools and in the barracks.

Patrick Chauvey, chief of Environmental Programs Management Branch, Directorate of Public Works, said Fort Benning

currently recycles \$1.4 million worth of recyclables annually. Chauvey said with recycling available in housing, that number will raise significantly.

An added benefit, Lovejoy said, is that Fort Benning will receive diversion rates out of implementing the program.

Leeder said Army leadership requires installations to divert materials from landfills.

"This will vastly increase our diversion rates," Leeder said. "Now that we're jumping on board with this, our recycling facility runs more efficiently and we can concentrate on bigger things."

Sgt. Maj. Milton Hamilton, sergeant major of the Directorate of Public Works, said the important thing is for all Soldiers and their Families to make a persistent effort to keep the recycling program alive.

"All Soldiers need to be aware of this program, and make sure they actually utilize the program," Hamilton said.

The garrison commander and the installation commander are strongly recommending residents participate wholeheartedly in this program, Lovejoy said.

"To make it a success, we have to all pull together as a team," Lovejoy said. "It's a great partnership for the city and it's going to benefit everybody."



ARTB selects 31 female Soldiers

Women to serve as observers, advisers for potential Ranger Course Assessment

The Airborne and Ranger Training Brigade selected 31 female Soldiers to serve as observers and advisers for a potential Ranger Course Assessment that would begin this spring.

The observer and advisers include 11 officers and 20 noncommissioned officers.

Since Nov. 7, the Soldiers have been involved in a weeklong training event to prepare them to understand the mental and physical demands placed on Ranger students.

"I was very satisfied with both the quality and quantity of the volunteers we received," said Maj. Gen. Scott Miller, commanding general of the Maneuver Center of Excellence. "Their performance and professionalism over the course of the week was extraordinary. This group did very well for what was a very physically challenging week for any Soldier."

The decision on whether to conduct an assessment of the Ranger Course will be made in January 2015. If conducted, the assessment of the course would include both female and male Soldiers, as well as female Soldiers to serve as observers and advisers to the cadre who conduct the course.

"We had a lot of high performing individuals participate in the training this week," said Col. David Fivecoat, commander of the Airborne and Ranger Training Brigade. "The Airborne and Ranger Training Brigade put them through some of the events that Ranger students attempt during Ranger training, interviewed them, and have selected the most qualified to return and work with us as advisers and observers."

"Our Ranger instructors displayed the professionalism that is expected from our officers and noncommissioned officers," said Command Sgt. Maj. Curtis H. Arnold Jr., of ARTB. "The overwhelming opinion from the (observers and advisers) candidates was that this was the most challenging, professional and rewarding experience of their careers. ... It truly reinforces our motto, Rangers Lead the Way," Arnold said.

The Ranger Course is 62 days long and conducted in three phases: the Benning Phase, which takes place here

at Camps Rogers and Darby; the mountain phase at Camp Frank D. Merrill in Dahlonega, Georgia, and the swamp and jungle phase at Camp James E. Rudder at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida.

During each phase Ranger students must receive a "passing grade" in one leadership position during a patrol, a positive peer review and no more than three major negative spot reports. In addition, they must successfully complete the Ranger Physical Assessment, a 12-mile road march, a land navigation course and the Combat Water Survival Assessment.





to go through the background check and be issued a temporary pass to get on the installation. Or, you'll be denied access and somebody can then bring you your ID."

In a change from current practice, not all gates will accept visitors. Instead, all visitor traffic will be routed to the Interstate 185 access control point and all trucks that weigh 5 tons or more will be sent to the Harmony Church ACP.

"Our hope in the future is that we'll be able to facilitate this through automation at any gate," Dillon said. But, right now, the only place we'll be doing visitor control is at the Interstate 185 gate. Harmony Church will be a backfill where we'll be sending all the trucks. All 5-ton and above trucks will be sent to Harmony Church, which has a marshaling area big enough for the large trucks. We don't have those marshaling areas at the other gates."

Background checks will be conducted using the National Crime Information Center Interstate Identification Index, a Federal Bureau of Investigation database Dillon said will provide criminal histories from all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Currently, Fort Benning is in the process of clearing as many people as possible, with a focus on contractors.

"The number one focus is vetting uncleared contractors," Dillon said. "An uncleared contractor is someone who does not possess a CAC card. If they have a military ID, that does not work for their contract. I'm a retiree and I have a military ID, but I need to have a CAC card for my current job. ... Between now and Jan. 1, we are trying to prevet all of these uncleared contractors. We're running background checks and getting them CAC cards in accordance with the requirements."

A visitor can be disqualified for access based on 11 different factors, but Dillon said only two of those factors will not take mitigating circumstances into account.

"There are only two that cannot be mitigated, and those are if we cannot verify your identity or if you are on a terrorist watch list," he said. "In both of those cases, you will be denied access. Everything else can be mitigated, but there is a mitigation process that you'll have to go through."

In addition, all visitors will need a valid reason for coming onto the installation or will need a government sponsor.

"The bottom line is if you do not have a valid reason to be on the installation and

Disqualifying factors for access to Fort Benning

Derogatory information that would bar installation access includes, but is not limited to, the following:

1. The National Crime Information Center Interstate Identification Index contains criminal arrest information about the individual that causes the installation commander to determine the individual presents a potential threat to good order, discipline, or health and safety of the installation.
2. The installation is unable to verify the individual's claimed identity based on the reasonable belief that the individual submitted fraudulent information concerning his or her identity in the attempt to gain access.
3. The individual has a current arrest warrant in NCIC, regardless of the offense or violation.
4. The individual is currently barred from entry to a federal installation or facility.
5. The individual has been convicted of crimes encompassing sexual assault, armed robbery, rape, child molestation, production or possession of child pornography, trafficking in humans, drug possession with intent to sell or drug distribution.
6. The individual has a U.S. conviction for espionage, sabotage or treason.
7. The individual is a registered sex offender.
8. The individual has a felony conviction within the past 10 years, regardless of the offense or violation.
9. The individual has been convicted of a felony firearms or explosives violation.
10. The individual has engaged in acts or activities designed to overthrow the U.S. government by force.
11. The individual is identified in the Terrorist Screening database as a known to be or suspected of being a terrorist or belonging to an organization with known links to terrorism or support of terrorist activity.

you do not have a government sponsor, you're not going to be coming on Fort Benning," Dillon said. "For example, anyone who is applying for a job at AAFES and is coming out to AAFES for an interview, AAFES is their sponsor for that visit. That's a valid reason to be here. If I just want to come out and look at Fort Benning, unless I have a sponsor who is willing to bring me, I'm going to be denied access."

Also, every person in a car who does not have a common access card, military ID or automated installation entry card

must complete a background check.

"In the past, if a car came and needed to get a pass to get in and you had 10 people in the car, one person came and got the pass and the car went through," Dillon said. "Now, everyone has to have the pass."

Currently, Dillon said background checks are expected to take about 10 minutes each, and considerations are being made to try and alleviate traffic at the I-185 ACP.

Staggered report times for workers after the holidays has been discussed, as has routing traffic to various other ACPs. Also, CAC or military ID holders are advised to avoid lanes marked for visitors, as those lanes marked CAC/MIL will move at a faster pace.

Also, visitors to the installation who are accompanied by a CAC, military ID or AIE card holder will be allowed to enter without a background check.

"If they're escorted by a government card-holding sponsor, that sponsor is responsible for them the entire time they're on the installation," Dillon said. "They're with them at all times. If they leave their side and don't know their whereabouts, then they're in violation."

While the changes may seem drastic, Dillon said Fort Benning will continue to try and accommodate as many visitors as possible.

"There are different events that will allow us to do different things, so if the public is invited to come out for something, we still want them to come out," he said. "These are areas where we may be able to do some mitigation to allow people to come out without a background check. We had 10,000 visitors for the 4th of July, and those are people we want to see out here. It's good for the military, it's good for the installation and it's good for Columbus and Phenix City."

The changes to ACP procedures could also impact Family members who attempt to attend various graduation ceremonies, something that is being taken into account.

"If a Family member has a Soldier getting ready to graduate from one of these schools, we're clearly going to have Family members, friends and loved ones that want to come out here and see graduations," Dillon said. "We're trying to get the word out to them early through the brigades and through the units so that they've got the ability to be notified where to go to get access to the installation and it may be something where we'll run a special event gate with a list of names and everyone coming for that event will go to that specific gate."

advance so they will know whether or not to even make arrangements to come."

While this is a DoD-wide initiative, Dillon said Fort Benning's unique circumstances are being taken into account.

"Fort Benning is different than other installations that might have FORSCOM Soldiers and not as many graduations," he said. "Every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, we've got a large influx of visitors, so we are going to look a lot different than other installations. We are planning on 9,600 non-CAC, non-military ID visitors or contractors daily, which is a big number. For comparison, Fort Bragg, North Carolina, averages 91,000 for the entire year."

Each visitor pass that is issued will be managed digitally, and its period of use will depend on the nature of the visit. For example, a Family member visiting a Soldier over the holidays may be able to obtain a pass that will be valid for a week or more, and other situations with mitigating circumstances will be taken into consideration.

Overall, Dillon said the impact on those who have a CAC or military ID should be minimal, provided they remember to always carry that card with them.

"Everybody who has a CAC card or military ID needs to get in the habit of carrying that with them," he said. "Do not leave it in your computer or at home."

their arm out, the birds are actually flying over your head," Kent said. "There is a lot more to see; it's very action-packed."

Master falconer Steve Hoddy will command the birds involved in the Birds of Prey program.

Hoddy, founder of EarthQuest, has been a wildlife educator and animal trainer for more than 30 years, according to the EarthQuest website. His experience includes having worked as a field researcher for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the study of peregrine falcons. According to the website, he also found one of the last known California condor nests in the wild. His position as master falconer is reportedly the highest position that can be achieved in his field.

Hoddy will provide information on the birds and their environment, as well as information on how participants can

responsibly react with nature.

EarthQuest is a non-profit environmental education organization, dedicated to the educating the public of their impact on the natural world, according to their website. It began in 1989 as an idea to educate the general public about wildlife through presentation of live animals in an entertaining format.

Kent said Oxbow Meadows linked up with EarthQuest more than a year ago and now has a contract with EarthQuest to take care of Oxbow Meadows' venomous snakes.

Nashville band pays tribute Family, rock and roll with Nov. 22 concert

When Nashville trio Goodbye June writes a song or performs on stage, it's a special tribute to rock and roll and to honor the memory of a late Family member.

The band will be in Columbus for a live performance at 9 p.m. Nov. 22 at The Loft, bringing original songs from their debut album and introducing new music to their fans.

Three cousins, guitarist Tyler Baker, vocalist Brandon Qualkenbush and Landon Milbourn formed Goodbye June following the tragic death of Baker's brother in June 2005.

Pfc. Shane Baker was home on leave from the Army when he was involved in a fatal car accident.

"He had just bought a new car, and he

had two weeks off and we were going to spend a lot of time together," Baker said. "He was one of a kind, an alpha male who loved doing physical things like boxing. He was a great role model for me."

Qualkenbush, Milbourn and the rest of the Family traveled to southern Indiana to comfort the Baker Family and pay their last respects. The band said writing songs and playing music during that time was a source of healing and revived an old passion within them.

"I think with all of us being Family and Tyler's brother passing away, it added that much more to what we had wanted to do for a long time," Milbourn said.

Over the next several months, the three spent time in Baker's basement writing original songs. They submitted their songs to a local studio to record jingles and radio commercials and recorded a demo.

"When people asked us what our band

name would be, we thought it would be a great way to honor that time together," Baker said.

Growing up surrounded by influences of gospel, blues and country hymns, the band blended those sounds with their love for rock legends such as Led Zeppelin and Bob Dylan. After touring across the Midwest for three years, it was a move to Nashville in 2009 that would take Goodbye June to a new level in their career.

Their first album "Nor The Wild Music Flow" was released in June 2012, with debut music video *Microscope* featuring St. Louis Rams head coach Jeff Fisher and country star Steve Holy. In the fall of 2013, the band traveled on a six-week European tour through Germany, Sweden, Finland, Netherlands, Belgium, France, and Spain.

"We did 30 dates in 35 days — it was

a blast," Baker said. "The reception for American rock bands in Europe is special and we had a great time. We made a ton of friends and fans that still contact us a year later. We hope to spend more time in Europe in 2015."

For now, Goodbye June is focused on writing songs each day in preparation for a new album with Grammy-nominated producer Paul Moak.

"The direction of our new music is more focused on rock and roll, it is more raw and focused," Qualkenbush said. "You can hear more ballads on our first album, but this time we're focused on up-tempo sounds. We want people to know we are a rock and roll band."

Small steps can aid in flu prevention

The leaves are starting to change color and the air is a little cooler. The change in season also brings with it a greater risk of seasonal influenza, more commonly known as the flu. Although the flu can occur at any time of year, there is usually a large increase in the number of people affected by it during October-May. The flu can cause serious problems and has the potential to threaten Army mission and readiness.

More than 30,000 people in the U.S. die from and more than 200,000 people are hospitalized because of seasonal flu each year.

Signs and symptoms of the flu include:

- fever
- cough
- sore throat
- runny or stuffy nose
- muscle or body aches
- headaches
- chills
- feeling tired or having low energy

Some individuals may experience vomiting and diarrhea. People can be infected with the flu and have symptoms like these without having a fever.

The flu is an illness caused by one or more viruses and it spreads easily between people, either when someone with the flu talks, coughs or sneezes and droplets containing their germs come into contact with your mouth, nose or eyes or if you touch something that has the flu virus on it and then touch your eyes, mouth or nose. Seasonal flu is not the same as the stomach flu, although they can have similar symptoms like vomiting and diarrhea. Seasonal flu is a

respiratory disease and not a stomach or intestinal disease.

By taking just a few steps, you can prevent the flu. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends taking the following three actions to fight the flu:

1. Get the flu vaccine each year.

This is the best way to prevent the flu, and it is required each year for active-duty, National Guard, Army Reserve members and any healthcare personnel who provide direct patient care in military Medical Treatment Facilities. It is also recommended for all other beneficiaries aged six months and older. Caregivers to young children should receive the vaccine, especially those who care for infants younger than 6 months old. Adults aged 65 years and older, pregnant women, children and those with chronic health conditions like asthma or diabetes are at higher risk of serious problems from the flu

and should get the vaccine as soon as it becomes available. TRICARE beneficiaries can get the flu vaccine at no cost from any of the following places: Military hospitals and clinics, any TRICARE-authorized provider and participating network pharmacies. Be sure to call your clinic, pharmacy or provider to see when vaccine is available. Active-duty, National Guard, Army Reserve and those who provide direct patient care within MTFs and must get the flu vaccine are urged to follow the direction of their unit or supervisor.

2. Stop the spread of germs in everyday activities.

In addition to getting the vaccine, other steps that you can take to reduce your likelihood of getting the flu include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water. When you do not have access to soap and water use an alcohol-based hand rub. When washing your hands,

do so for at least 20 seconds, which is as long as it takes you to hum the song "Happy Birthday" twice.

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you sneeze or cough and throw the used tissue away.
- Cough or sneeze in your upper sleeve or elbow when you don't have any tissue.
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose or eyes.
- Disinfect commonly used surfaces and objects, such as doorknobs and toys.
- Keep away from people that may be sick.
- Stay home from school, work or other group settings if you are sick, except to get medical care or to get items that you need.
- Maintain good health habits by living the Performance Triad, a top priority of the Army surgeon general, which includes getting at least 7-8 hours of sleep every 24 hours, being active and eating healthy.

3. Take antiviral medicine if your healthcare provider gives them to you.

This medicine cannot cure the flu. However, it can make the illness shorter and can also prevent more serious problems. Antiviral medicine must be prescribed by a healthcare provider. The medicine works best when started within two days of getting sick. Follow your healthcare provider's instructions for taking the medicine.

By taking these three steps for yourself and your Family, you can have a healthier flu season and help keep the Army family healthy. Dear Consumer Ed:

My husband keeps clicking on every pop-up ad that comes up on the Internet. As a result, he has downloaded malware, which has slowed down the computer and created unwanted toolbars, coupon services and even an unwanted security software program. Short of barring him from the computer entirely, what is the best way to protect our computer from being hacked?

A: With hackers and identity thieves frequently finding new ways to attack your computer, there are some basic security steps you can take to protect your computer and your personal information. Malware, the nickname for "malicious software," includes viruses and spyware that can be remotely installed on your computer when you download programs on the Internet to play games, listen to music and other activities. It may be used to send consumers pop-up ads, redirect their computers to unwanted

websites, monitor their Internet usage, or record their keystrokes, which, in turn, could lead to identity theft. Here are some ways to protect your computer from malware:

- Install reputable security software. At a minimum, your computer should have anti-virus and anti-spyware software, and a firewall. Viruses can be planted in emails or attachments to emails, in programs or files that you download and even in websites you visit. These viruses have the potential to wipe out your computer files. Anti-virus software scans everything that enters your computer, looking for these viruses. Spyware is software that tracks your computer activity, gathering information without your knowledge. Anti-spyware software blocks or removes spyware. You may obtain the anti-virus and anti-spyware software separately or as a package. For lists of security tools from legitimate security vendors, visit staysafeonline.org

or security.getnetwise.org/tools/search.

- Use a firewall. A firewall is a virtual barrier between your computer and the Internet. Everything coming into or leaving your computer must go through the firewall, which blocks anything that doesn't meet specific security criteria. Before purchasing separate firewall hardware or software, check your operating system to see if there is a built-in firewall and whether it is turned on.

- Update system and software frequently. Computer and software companies frequently update their programs to include protection against new security threats. Simply updating your operating system and software whenever new versions become available gives you an added measure of security. If available, activate automatic security updates so you will be alerted when updates are issued.

- Avoid "free" security scans. Be suspicious of an offer of a "free security scan," especially when faced with an unexpected pop-up, email, or an ad that claims "malicious software" has been found on your computer. Though the "alerts" look like they're being generated by your computer, they actually are created by a scammer and sent through your Internet browser.

If you suspect a problem, shut down your browser. Don't click "No" or "Cancel," or even the "x" at the top right corner of the screen. Some of these scams are designed so that any of those buttons can activate the program. If you use Windows, press Ctrl + Alt + Delete to open your Task Manager, and click "End Task." If you use a Mac, press Command + Option + Q + Esc to "Force Quit." Complete a separate search of the program to determine if it is legitimate.

- Download carefully. Don't download programs from websites you don't know and trust. Don't download or share music or movie files with strangers — the file you receive could contain a virus, spyware or inappropriate content. (And, unauthorized file sharing of copyrighted material is illegal.)

- Create and protect strong passwords. Create strong email passwords and protect them with the following tips:

- The longer the password, the tougher it is to crack. Use at least 10 characters.

- Mix letters, numbers, and special characters. Try to be random — don't use your name, birthdate, or common words.

- Don't use the same password for different accounts. If it's stolen from you, it can be used to take over all your accounts.

- Don't share passwords on the phone, in texts or by email. Legitimate companies will not send you messages asking for your password.

- Keep your passwords in a secure place, out of plain sight.

- Use a pop-up blocker. Don't click on links or open attachments in emails unless you know what they are, even if the emails seem to be from friends or family.

- Use the spam filter. Use your email program's automatic spam filter, which reduces the number of unwelcome email messages that make it to your inbox. Delete, without opening, any spam or "junk mail" that gets through the filter.

- Backup important data. No system is completely secure. Copy important files onto a removable disc or an external hard drive and store it in a safe place. If your computer is compromised, you'll still have access to your files.

- Report possible fraud. report possible fraud online at www.ftc.gov/complaint or by phone at 1-877-FTC-HELP.

"We believe Kathleen's Klostet is a great way of embracing our Families and providing them a feasible opportunity to participate in esprit de corps events like unit formal balls," King said. "We really





The rules station, Cook said, addressed rules like offside and icing.




