

In the attached packet you will find information about the Fort Leonard Wood Public Affairs Office's submission for the community relations program category. The Fort Leonard Wood Public Affairs Office worked with several cities, sports teams and organizations to broaden the appreciation of our military with the residents of Missouri throughout the year. The program included outreach in the form of military appreciation days with the St. Louis Cardinals Major League Baseball team, the St. Louis Rams National Football League team, the Springfield Cardinals, a minor league baseball affiliation to the St. Louis Cardinals, the Missouri State Fair, the I-44 Speedway and appreciation days with universities in Rolla and Columbia, Mo. In addition, the outreach program provided military support for Game 4 of the 2013 Major League Baseball World Series, held Oct. 27, 2013.

This program begins coordination with the organizations early in the year to ensure that the event can proceed with positive responses. In 2013, an additional challenge of conducting these outreach appreciation programs was a curtailment of funding at several levels, but by prioritizing the events and working with community leaders, the events were still able to reach thousands of Missouri citizens and millions more through televised events.

The events were all considered successful based on each organization or team's willingness to continue the program into 2014 and in most cases, expand the appreciation to other events as well. While the impact of any appreciation day is hard to measure, there is no doubt that the responses received by the command on participating in these events have increased the positive perceptions of the United States Army with the citizens of Missouri.

The annual Fort Leonard Wood Military Appreciation Program is a series of events, which begins in February and ends in November of each year. This program encompasses Military Appreciation day events across the state of Missouri, commencing in Rolla to Springfield, Sedalia, St. Louis, Lebanon, Waynesville, Columbia, and coming back to Rolla.

The Military Appreciation Program is locally and nationally televised with a total of about 66,000 spectators.

**Summary**

The annual Fort Leonard Wood Military Appreciation Program honors our service members and their families for the sacrifices they make every day to serve and support our nation. This program also provides our surrounding communities an opportunity to engage our service members in an enjoyable and relaxing setting.

Even though each event may be somewhat different, they all occur for one cause – to pay tribute to our Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen, Coast Guard members, and their families.

The program traditionally kicks off in February at the Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla, Mo., continuing with our Military Appreciation Program line up in Springfield, Lebanon, Sedalia, St. Louis, Waynesville, and ending back where we started – Rolla. At each of these events, our commanding general or representative, along with the installation command sergeant major, take part in ceremonial first pitches and coin tosses.

Our 399<sup>th</sup> Army Band performs “The Star-Spangled Banner”, while the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence’s Joint Services Color Guard posts the colors. Several hundred service members are recognized at these events.

**Planning**

Planning for the Fort Leonard Wood Military Appreciation Program is continuous; there is no break. Area communities request troops, the 399th Army Band, joint services color guard, post commanding general, command sergeant major, Drill Sergeant and Advanced Individual Platoon Sergeant of the Year to participate in the Military Appreciation Day Program events beginning in February and ending in November.

The Fort Leonard Wood Public Affairs Office works closely with our G-3 Operations section to task for support of the events, which make up our Military Appreciation Program. We also have meetings and coordinate with various organizations to support this program. In addition, PAO tailors and recommends diversified support based on the requesting organizations' needs.

With PAO's provided input, our G-3 sets suspense dates for units and organizations to ensure coordination and participation are completed in a timely manner and all responses of support are tracked.

PAO works closely with various organizations to provide personnel, operational, logistical, planning, and resource support for this program.

**Execution**

With the curtailment of funding, accomplishing a successful 2013 Military Appreciation Program was a challenge. The majority of these events required exceptions to policy and final approval by the Assistant to the Secretary of Defense (Public Affairs).

However, in working with civic organizations, universities, and sports management teams, Fort Leonard Wood was able to provide continued support for our great and well-established Military Appreciation Program.

This program consists of:

- Ceremonial first pitches, coin tosses
- Recognition of service members during pre-game ceremonies and at half time
- Opportunities for service members to showcase their talents – playing of the national anthem, singing of patriotic songs
- Activities, firework displays, and shout outs for the Soldiers
